## Being Family Romans 8:15-17; Ephesians 5:22-32

If I have been adopted into God's family, then my attitude and my \_\_\_\_\_\_ should reflect that. I am in. I can stop striving to get in or trying to justify being in and can start representing the family with confidence.

Discussion 1. Some people help needy people out of a sense of guilt. Some do so to make a statement. And some help because of genuine love for those they are helping. How do you know which you are? How do you check your motives for the good "Christian" things you do?

Discussion 2. Have you been a part of churches that did not feel like family? Have you been a part of churches that DID? Compare and contrast the two. What, specifically, were the differences?

Discussion 5. How does this lesson cause you to pray? How does it prepare your heart for worship?
