Restoration is Personal John 19:31-37

We risk doing real spiritual damage when we cannot tell the difference between our faith and our cultural expressions of that faith. If we are not careful, we can in our traditions.
Discussion 1. Having our faith and our cultural expressions of that faith so bundled together that we cannot tell them apart is a dangerous thing. Can you think of any examples in your own life?

Discussion 3. How is spiritual restoration personal for you? How might you finish this sentence: "There was a time in my life when but then Jesus" In other words, how has Jesus changed your life?
For the Christ follower, there is a clarifying sense in which all of scripture either points forward to or points back to Either way, Jesus is more than just the founder of this revolution: He is our entire operating system.
Discussion 4. What's the difference between Jesus being an important influence in my life and Jesus being my entire operating system? How would you describe that difference in your own life?
