Discussion 1. Recall a moment or circumstance in your life when you felt overwhelmed by just how big God is; does the "bigness" of God encourage you or does it scare you?

Being shown grace by another person is a warm feeling, worthy of our emotional response. Being shown grace by the Sovereign Creator of the universe, on the other hand, is ______ in a fall-on-my-face-and-weep kind of way.

Discussion 4. Has God's grace (either on your behalf or on behalf of someone you know) ever made you weep? Has there ever been a time when you felt BOTH rebuke/discipline from God AND love/grace from God at the same time? How would you explain that to a nonbelieving friend?

Discussion 5. How does this lesson cause you to pray? How does it prepare your heart for worship?
