## The Spirit of Freedom Romans 8:1-4

For the Christ follower, Jesus' sacrifice permanently changed our with God from constant separation (with
occasional reconciliation) to constant reconciliation (even with occasional straying on our part).
Discussion 1. What practical effect(s) are there for you, knowing that there is now "no condemnation" for those who are in Christ? How does this reality encourage you?
Political freedom, as important as it seems to us, pales in significance to the spiritual freedom we have in Christ. The former may last a lifetime (at best), but the latter is Which kind of freedom will have your attention today?
Discussion 2. How would you describe your "freedom in Christ" to a non-believing friend? What difference does "freedom from the law of sin and death" make in your everyday life?
What your obedience to God's law can do: help you experience a deeper walk with Him once you have actually decided to begin that walk. What your obedience to God's law cannot do: move you (or anyone around you) into a with God in the first place.
Discussion 3. How does thinking about your faith as a relationship help you better understand the place of "the law" in your life? Does this mean there is no place for the law in your life? Explain.
Christ followers do not obey God's Word in order to be set free from sin; we obey God's Word we have been set free. It is an important distinction.
Discussion 4. How does obeying God's law help a Christ follower to experience Him better? Why do you think obeying God's law doesn't help a non-believer experience God?
Discussion 5. How does this lesson cause you to pray? How does it prepare your heart for worship?
