Discussion 1. Recall/share about a time when you realized you were becoming like your mother or your father. Did it surprise you?

Discussion 2. What are the world's sources of wisdom/truth, where we often look for answers before going to God?
God doesn't live on a timeline like we do. While we are arguing about yesterday's mistakes and fretting about tomorrow's terrors, He is standing in the midst of them all, of Who He is.
Discussion 3. Are there parts of your own history that God has helped you remember correctlythat He has helped you learn from? Are there parts of your family's history that God has helped you learn from?
In the most uncertain of times, God is still a very present help, assuring us of Who He is, who we are, what He is doing, and what we must do and know that He is God.
Discussion 4. Share an example of how your new rhythms in the midst of this Coronavirus have actually helped you focus more on God? Does Psalm 46 mean something more or different to you under these current circumstances?
Discussion 5. How does this lesson cause you to pray? How does it prepare your heart for worship?
