Discussion 1. What do you think it means to invest in our relationship with God? Can you give examples? What does it mean to invest in our relationships with others? Examples?
God asks me, "What do you want?" Not so much in order to give it to me, but more to help me see my own Spiritual transformation aims to change how I answer that question over time.
Discussion 2. How has your honest answer to the question, "What do you want?" changed over time? How has spiritual maturity shaped the desires of your heart?
The more we treasure the things of this material world, the more blinded we become to and realities. To follow Jesus is to seek after spiritual truth first and foremost, so that we can better see the truth about this world.
Discussion 3. Can you think of any ways your understanding of spiritual truth (like scripture) has helped you better understand yourself or the world around you? What is the danger of allowing our understanding of the world to dictate how we interpret scripture instead of letting scripture dictate how we understand the world?
If the message in the Sermon on the Mount is that the kingdom of God is here and it is very different from the ways of the world, then the call to action is simple: " whom you will serve."
Discussion 4. Do you think choosing the master we will serve is a one-time choice or,

rather, a choice we must make over and over again? How do you know if you have truly

chosen Jesus over all other masters? How can you test yourself?
