## Dealing with Doubt Luke 24:36-43; John 20:24-29

For those on the threshold of a decision to follow Jesus, \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_\_ with His resurrection are only natural, even common. Jesus welcomes those doubts and engages them and lovingly navigates them with us.

Discussion 1. Can you remember a time in your life when you had doubts about Jesus' resurrection? How did you navigate those doubts? Who helped you? What helped you?

Discussion 3. Can you think of how "rejoicing with those who rejoice and mourning with those who mourn" has specifically benefited you?

Learning to hear from and experience God through His indwelling Spirit in others has always been a critical \_\_\_\_\_\_ in the church. Spiritual formation in community with other believers is foundational to the Christian faith and cannot be overstated.

Discussion 4. What can you do to help you better experience Jesus in others? What can you do to help others better experience Jesus in you?
